Introduction

ISC Water and Heritage

Water is an essential part of all cultural heritage. Without meaningful water management no human life is possible and therefore no cultural achievements. In addition, water plays an elementary role in coping with present and future challenges. A variety of material heritage and cultural practices are directly related to water, e.g. water supply systems, flood protection, dams and water wheels, agriculture, waterscapes and urban deltas as well as governance, religious and spiritual practices, and administrative systems.

Water related heritage merits public awareness and protection as living assets. This cultural heritage is a rich source of inspiration for sustainable solutions to water-specific problems. Water related heritage can help us build fairer and more resilient societies. The aim of ISC Water is to explore the diverse aspects of water related heritage in more detail; to advocate recognition and protection; to increase public awareness of water-related heritage as a source of traditional knowledge; to highlight the significance of water related heritage for management and planning design; and to communicate the value of water-related heritage for the livelihoods of communities into the future.

Long term vision

"Our vision for the future is to articulate and communicate the significance of water related cultural heritage for present and future management challenges and strengthen the social and economic livelihoods of worldwide communities. We aim to contribute to climate mitigation and resilience efforts, ensuring the preservation and sustainability of water related cultural assets for future generations."

Mission Statement and Objectives

This Mission Statement defines the remit of the International Scientific Committee on Water and Heritage (ISC Water) and helps affinity partners to recognize when their activities concern matters in relation to which they may engage with the ISC Water. The ISC is dedicated to the research, protection and promotion of water-related cultural heritage and its material, conceptual, political and spiritual aspects. The Committee's aim is to advance comprehension and dissemination of the knowledge and experience contained in the World's water heritage and harness it to sustainably address the water-related concerns of the present and future.

Specifically, the objectives of the Committee are to:

- Create an international platform for interaction between ICOMOS, its ISCs and other heritage
 organizations and the water sector; governments, agencies, associated communities and NGOs, for
 networking, education and dialogue about the significance and management of water related heritage.
- Develop methodologies, training, policies and good design process, responding to traditional wisdom, to inform climate change mitigation and adaptation, and improve current and future water management and planning.
- Generally, strengthen the role of water related heritage in social engagement and policy-making.
